Future Safety Leadership Conference Attended

On November 2nd through the 4th student section President Chris Moore and Vice President Brian Lauer attended a FSL conference held at the Crown Plaza in Rosemont, Illinois. The event was a great learning experience as well as a networking opportunity. The conference covered topics ranging from the importance of using Linked-In to first year

“mess ups” for young safety professionals. The conference also hosted classes for creating a cover letter, the interview process, and also reviewed and critiqued resumes. Another helpful class allowed students to undergo mock interviews with companies from The Hartford, Liberty Mutual, CNA, URS construction, and Actuant who deals in

general industry. The mock interviews were conducted like a normal interview, except at the end each student was provided with feedback on their responses.
