Steps to Apply for Graduation

1. Contact the Registrar's Office to make an appointment for a final graduation check and obtain an "Application for Graduation." **Students completing a Master's degree must contact the Graduate Office (A-307) for specific graduate instructions.**
2. Complete and sign the application for graduation and submit it to the Registrar's Office.
3. At the final graduation check, the Registrar's Office will evaluate your records to determine that you will complete all graduation requirements by the end of the term. If approved, you will receive a final clearance form that must be approved by your advisor.
4. Make an appointment to meet with your advisor to complete a final degree check. Your advisor must verify that all major requirements will be met by the end of the term and complete and sign the advisor portion of the final clearance form. Depending on the major, approval from the department chair and/or the second major/minor advisors may be required.
5. Once approved for graduation by your advisor, return the signed final clearance form to the Registrar's Office.
6. To finalize the graduation application process, you will be given a "Graduation Clearance Note" which will require signature from the Financial Aid Office and the Business Office. You will also receive information about Commencement.
7. Once the graduation clearance note is approved by the Financial Aid and the graduation fee is paid in the Business Office, return a copy to the Registrar's Office.
