PLACES SECOND OVERALL IN THE STATE; WINS LARGEST LOCAL CHAPTER AWARD

The Future Business Leaders of America—Collegiate (FBLA—Collegiate, formerly known as Phi Beta Lambda) professional student chapter from Southeastern performed well at the recent FBLA Collegiate State Leadership Conference held March 24-25 in Edmond, Oklahoma. Southeastern's FBLA team placed 2nd overall in the state having the most state finalists.

Team members included: Tiffany Bray, Dr. Luqman Dabiri, M.D., Suvobroto Ghatak, Randall Hamm, Kristin Hatter, Ahmed Ibrahim, Naomi Jones, Jessica Mumme, Katelyn Nilsen, Calli Singh, and Darrien Williams, each of whom competed in a variety of competitive events. The top four students are recognized at the state competition, and then eligible to move to compete at the National Leadership Conference held in June in Atlanta, Georgia. Southeastern's team had 11 first place winners, seven second place winners, five 3rd place winners, and two fourth place winners. The chapter also won the award for "largest local chapter."

The state competitive events represented by the team included Cyber Security, Entrepreneurship Concepts, Foundations of Accounting, Foundations of Finance, Information Management, Macroeconomics, Management Concepts, Marketing Concepts, Microeconomics, Organizational Behavior & Leadership, Project Management, Retail Management, and Sport Management & Marketing. On November 16, 2023, Dr. Mellena Nichols, Assistant Professor in the Department of Occupational Safety &Health presented to an international audience at the International Public Safety Association monthly webinar.

Her topic, "What Firefighters Need to Know About Fatigue On and Off Duty," was based on her recent dissertation research *Under the Influence? An Evaluation of the Impact Fatigue has on Cognitive Function of Firefighters Working 24 and 48 -hour Shifts.* The objectives of this presentation were to identify fatigue risk factors, assess a variety of fatigue control measures, and identify the steps to developing a site-specific fatigue management plan.



These areas represent three of


