Part B: Alignment of Intellectual Contributions with Mission

Mission: The JMSB prepares a diverse population of learners for meaningful careers and service through innovative business education, impactful research, and engagement with the communities we serve.

The JMSB acknowledges and appreciates all forms of research across all disciplines and interdisciplinary and encourages a mix of research activities that correspond with the interests and unique talents of the faculty while also supporting our mission. Along with the 67% applied ICs, faculty also produced 16% and 17% basic and teaching and learning ICs, respectively.

Part C: Quality of Intellectual Contributions

The JMSB emphasizes that faculty publish in PRJs that are indexed by Cabells Journalytics with an acceptance rate of 50% or less (refer to Faculty Qualifications Criteria in upload in myAccreditation) or approved journals though an informal internal process. Forty-one of the 54 articles published in PRJs are indexed in Cabells (refer to Table C-1). Of these 41 PRJs, 16 are in journals with an acceptance rate of 20% or less, and 24 are in journals with an acceptance rate of 21-40%, and one PRJ is in a journal with an acceptance rate of 41-50%. Two other PRJs are indexed in the prestigious Australian Business Deans Council (ABDC) list (see Table C-2). Eleven are indexed in both Cabells and ABDC. Ten PRJs are in other refereed journals approved by exceptions. Exceptions were granted when journals were shown to be indexed in other databases (i.e., Scopus), recognized by peer and/or aspirant schools, or widely recognized as peer reviewed industry publications.

Part D: Impact of Intellectual Contributions

Business faculty members research impact is demonstrated by the number and quality of ICs totaling 163 over the five-year reporting period. Included in this number are 54 peer-reviewed journal articles, multiple books, cases, and chapters, and numerous conference proceedings. The impact of these JMSB faculty ICs is also evident from the quality of the journal outlets mentioned in Part C. In addition, the impact of faculty research is evidenced by citations of published works (see Table D-1).









These three retired faculty accounted for an additional citation count for JMSB Business Division faculty of 3,237 citations according to Google Scholar, with 1,664 citations since 2018. Research Gate reported these three faculty members having accounted for 1,250 citations. Likewise, these three had an average h-index of 17.33 or 12.67 since 2018, and a i10-index of 26.67 and an i10-index of 16.33 since 2018. Their Research Gate reported h-index was an average 11.67. Their Average Research Index Score was 658.10, and the Total Number of Reads was 210,241 for an average of 70,080 reads per faculty member. These three retired faculty members also accounted for 180 recommendations, or an average 60 per faculty member.

Finally, as shown in the faculty CVs, research impact is evident from research awards (see Table D-3) including outstanding research and best paper awards, engagement in journal editorships, editorial boards and ad hoc reviewer services, textbook publications, presentations on research at events, and stakeholder outreach, just to name a few.

ICs Impacting Society

Table D-4 shows select exemplars of scholarly activity that have had positive societal impact on industry, academia, student learning, and public policy. JMSB faculty have an innate ability to conduct research that is relevant to this array of stakeholders. Those in industry who are operating local businesses and providing economic growth for the region have a direct link to JMSB's ICs. Whether by attending the Women in Entrepreneurship Conference, collaborating with faculty to explore a specific phenomenon, or benefiting from the dissemination of knowledge in the JMSB Newsletter or faculty speaking engagements, the ICs from the faculty are being utilized for guidance. As evidenced through citation counts, the ICs at JMSB are being shared and referenced by colleagues throughout academia. Students benefit from these ICs by developing critical thinking skills when solving business cases published by JMSB faculty. Further, JMSB students have opportunities to collaborate with faculty on undergraduate and graduate research projects, enabling students to grow their passion for research and present papers during regional and national conferences.
