


#### 1. Are you a first year teacher?







### 2a. In what area did you receive your degree?






## 2b. In what year did you receive your degree?

The courses that stood out to me as particlularly important were my reading courses. They showed me how to effectively interact with students in a classroom setting.




### 11a. How much time did you spend with your mentor teacher?



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

Having a teacher that spent time actually explaining things a little better. Also having one with a little more patience with me.







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

What experiences in your educator preparation/route to certification stand...

The experiences that stood out for me were the field experiences and student teaching. These areas provided the opportunity to apply all that I had been taught in the classroom.

Field experiences with a variety of grade levels and teachers with varied experience levels.

Working with children with learning difficulties helps us to use a variety of types and organizations to adapt for each child. Learning should be fun for all children. The range of ways information can be presented is never ending. All children are able to learn, it is up to us to find out how.

Student teaching and the observation hours.

Student teaching definitely stands out to me as important because you can always learn something from your mentor teacher whether it be good or bad.

The experiences that stand out as particularly important were anytime I was able to work with students first hand. Observations and interacting in the actual classrooms made all the course work meaningful.

The two most important things that I experienced were being blind and volunteering to work at the Special Olympics. Being blind made you have to trust someone that you didn't really know to guide you through the halls, which relates to education in the way that these students may or may not have a clue as to what you are teaching them, but you have to find a way to get them to trust you and listen to what you are saying so that they do understand and no longer feel lost. Volunteering to work at the Special Olympics was an amazing experience. I went there for a class assignment (we had the choice of observing at a school or volunteering) and it showed me that the people (or students) that are often times over-looked are the ones that appreciate someone helping or teaching them the most.
