

Further prepare teachers to teach students with disabilities in the inclusive classroom environment. It has been my experience, teachers are not prepared with knowledge of disabilities and effective differentiating of instruction.
Maybe more work with classroom management.

1. I would suggest more in classroom time before the school year starts. Teacher candidates need to understand all it takes to set up a classroom, especially an early childhood classroom. There is a great deal of work to be done before kids walk in on day 1, these new teachers have no idea. 2. Organizational skills - managing/filing - student information, tests scores, weekly assignments, field trip permissions/sack lunch forms/fees, etc., student portfolios. Being organized is important in a classroom.
