



Please share some ideas on improving the mentorship experience. One thing that I've noticed about the college level instructional knowledge is that the student teachers/first year teachers are being taught that lesson plans are rigid. They are being asked to make lesson plans SO far in advance without learning that it's ok when day to day chaos of schedules and changes in learners' needs will not allow for a 6 week schedule to be made. It's a great practice to have a map but day to day schedules at a six week pace are not conducive in a classroom. Also, s major frustration after classroom management/student engagement is the "extras" needed as a teacher: the documentation, the phone class, the paperwork. This is something she was not prepared to find in the classroom. I feel like this program is a rewarding experience for anyone who chooses to participate. I love that been so accepting of help, so excited about being an educator, and so open to change. The conversations that she and I have had the pleasure of exploring has helped her as a new teacher, but also helped me explore my own thoughts and beliefs about best practices, the needs of our students, and my excitement for education. I honestly don't believe that we can improve this process. None at this time. I would suggest more one on one time prior to the start of the school year to prepare a mentee for the atmosphere of the specific school. None at this time. I think potentially it might be a good idea to involve an additional teacher as mentor. (team mentorship) is doing a fabulous job and works with students of all levels, including students with special needs. She has learned to adapt her lessons to the individual needs of students with learning disabilities. struggled with classroom management as far as discipline, but this is something that she has improved in

several times and offered behavioral strategies that she has used in her
