FROM THE SENATE MEETING ON MARCH 8, 2023

The Faculty Senate voted unanimously to approve the addition of Amanda St. John as member of the **Graduate Council** due to her appointment as Coordinator of new Nursing & Allied Health graduate program.

The **Executive Committee** (**EC**) will meet with President Newsom on March 20. The primary subject of discussion will be the progress – if any – administration has made on their review of the Compensation Proposal drafted earlier this year by the **Budget** (**BC**) and **Personnel Policies** (**PPC**) **Committees**. Among other updates to the current Salary Card, this proposal calls for an adjustment for inflation since the last known update to the Salary Card in 2008.

As we begin the Spring II semester, the Senate would like to remind all instructors of the updated **Office Hours Policy** reflected in <u>Academic Policies and Procedure Manual</u> (Section 4.9.1): Unless contractually obligated otherwise, a full-time faculty member is required to schedule office hours according to the following ratio: half as many office hours per week as credit hours taught in a given semester. In addition, full-time faculty are expected to be available additional hours by appointment. Of the given number of office hours, full-time faculty members teaching online classes should be available for synchronous online office hours in approximate proportion to their online teaching load. Departments will establish policies regarding the expected mechanisms for online office hours, and for publicizing faculty office hours.

The **Planning Committee** (**PC**) announced it will be emailing out a link to vote for Faculty Awards before Spring Break. Be on the lookout for this message and be sure to recognize your peers!

The Senate also discussed the Community Perception Survey results shared during <u>the</u> <u>Town of Durant Town Hall meetings on March 6 and 7</u>. Of significant note was the community's high opinion of the university and its role, as well as the steep increase in housing costs in Durant over the last three years.
