FROM THE SENATE MEETING ON 15 NOVEMBER 2023

The **Treasurer** was absent and had no report.

The **Budget Committee (BC)** was not present and had no report.

The **Executive Committee (EC)** did not meet and has no report.

The **Planning Committee (PC)** had no report.

Committee on Committees (CC) has compiled a list of the committees and councils, with their current chairs. Chair Clark has provided that to the Senate for its use.

Personnel Policies (PPC) Committees has divided its charges and prioritized them. Chair Cotter-Lynch reports that **PPC** has asked for time at the Spring Symposium to communicate a sensitive information policy for student records and has asked to make that some process for the Chairs' Council. The takeaway is that FERPA-sensitive information should be accessed only on university platforms, not emailed to personal emails, and, if printed, should be destroyed.

The **University Affairs Committee (UAC)** did not meet, but is working on its charges.
