What To Do

- If you need immediate help or are not safe, call the police.
- Do what you need to do to feel safe. Call someone you trust or go to a safe place.
- Take threats seriously.
- Seek guidance whether communication with the assailant is appropriate.
- Document every incident.
- Hold the assailant accountable for their actions. Don't make excuses for them. Remember this is not your fault.
- Tell someone you trust that something is happening to you.
- Be aware of using technology. Consider disabling your location services and geotags on your phone and photos.

Remember to trust your instincts. If you feel unsafe, you probably are.

Interim Safety Measures

The Office of Student Affairs can put in place interim measures for student complainants of sexual harassment and sexual violence as needed. A formal complaint does not need to be submitted to have interim measures put into place. The university will maintain confidentiality to the extent possible.

- Reporting: filing a complaint with the university conduct process and the appropriate law enforcement agencies against the student(s) who caused harm.
- No Contact Order: prohibits contact between both parties through any means of communication, as well as prohibits others from making contact on their behalf.
- Emergency Protective Order: court ordered petition that prohibits contact.
- Safety Measures: any reasonable arrangements that are necessary for ongoing safety
 - transportation or providing an escort
 - priority for access to facilities and services for the victim and/or restriction to respondent
- Living Arrangements: changing on-campus living arrangements for that of the victim and/or respondent to ensure safety
- Academic Arrangements: adjusting academic schedules to ensure safety
- Other Measures: counseling, medical support and referral, privacy flag on directory information, academic support services

Confidential Reporting Options provides students with the ability to confidentially report and discuss an instance of sexual harassment, including sexual violence, without their information being shared with others:
