What To Do

- If you need immediate help or are not safe, call the police or the Crisis Control Center.
- Do what you need to do to feel safe. Call someone you trust or go to a safe place.
- Do not shower, bathe, douche, change or destroy clothes, eat, drink, smoke, chew gum, take any medications or straighten the location of the incident.
- Go to the ER and receive care for any physical injuries that may have occurred. Treatment will be provided, free of charge, for sexually transmitted infections and to prevent pregnancy.
- You will be examined by a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE). There will be a sexual response advocate and police officer available for support. The advocate, with your permission, will support you through the entire exam.
- The advocate will provide you with a packet of information about follow-up medical needs, support services, and common reactions to sexual assault.

Remember, you are not alone and are in no way responsible for your assault.

Interim Safety Measures

The Vice President for Student Affairs can put in place interim measures for student complainants of sexual harassment and sexual violence as needed. A formal complaint does not need to be submitted to have interim measures put into place. The university will maintain confidentiality to the extent possible.

- Reporting: filing a complaint with the university conduct process and the appropriate law enforcement agencies against the student(s) who caused harm.
- No Contact Order: prohibits contact between both parties through any means of communication, as well as prohibits others from making contact on their behalf.
- Emergency Protective Order: court ordered petition that prohibits contact.
- Safety Measures: any reasonable arrangements that are necessary for ongoing safety
 - transportation or providing an escort
 - priority for access to facilities and services for the victim and/or restriction to respondent
- Living Arrangements: changing on-campus living arrangements for that of the victim and/or respondent to ensure safety
- Academic Arrangements: adjusting academic schedules to ensure safety
- Other Measures: counseling, medical support and referral, privacy flag on directory information, academic support services

Reporting Options

Confidential Reporting Options provides students with the ability to confidentially report and discuss an instance of sexual harassment, including sexual violence, without their information being shared with others:
