I. Insurance Report

Insurance Report:

In response to the rate increase of Health Choice of 12% for employees and 18% for dependants this Ad Hoc Committee held meetings once a month to review numerous offers with lower rate increases, varying co-pay, and prescription benefits. The Committee's recommendation for lowest overall with a premium savings of over \$400,000 was Blue Cross/Blue Shield (BCBS)

Dr. Matthews (with additions by Cathy Conway):

Changes were a result of the collaborative efforts of the Faculty Senates of all the regional institutions. Each Institution has its own Ad Hoc Committee. The consultant firm of Gallagher was hired to conduct independent research of insurance plans. All the regional institutions voted unanimously to go to BCBS. The plan is similar to Health Choice:

- Almost all benefits are identical
- Major difference is lower premiums
- Co-pay is the same (Health Choice doubled)
- Network sites are available across the nation (i.e. Wilson N Jones, TMC, SE Med., and Mayo Clinic)
 - No guarantee for every provider to be on BCBS
 - If a doctor does not take BCBS, bring the doctor's name to BCBS and they will contact the doctor
 - Major negative for BCBS: there is a \$2,000,000 lifetime maximum beginning Jan. 1, 2010
 - If member is taking a very expensive prescription they may be asked to go on a step program (try a lesser expensive RX. Expensive RXs can be filled before April 1st with no problem—after that, a step program would be requested)
- No pre-existing clause for all who sign before January 1, 2010
- Dental: Blue Cross (helped to get lower rate on health coverage)
- Vision: no change
- New: member can self refer to specialist
- No longer have to get pre-authorization for MRI if recommended by a doctor (Health Choice required pre-approval anyway)
- COBRA change to Healthsmart
- After Medicare age: Supplemental Insurance –Plan 65, Medicare for RX
- Special questions: email HR at hr@se.edu --they will send the question to BCBS and a response will be on their website for all to see.

II. Proposal recommended to change membership on the Faculty Appellate Committee to replace Ken Chinn since he is now Faculty Senate Chair. Unanimous agreement that Diane Dixon replace Ken Chinn.

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III. Proposal, Ken Chinn: Senators are asked to send proposals to Dr. Chinn before the scheduled meeting. That proposal will be sent to the entire Faculty Senate so that senators can come to the meeting prepared to make informed discussion and decisions
