Meet all other graduation requirements listed below.

Graduation requirements:

1. A minimum of 124 to graduate with a Bachelor's degree.
2. A maximum of 64 hours may be transferred from a 2-year college.
3. 60 hours from a 4-year college.
4. 30 hours must be taken from SOSU.
5. 40 Hours of 3000 & 4000 level courses
6. 15 of last 30 hours taken toward degree must be taken at SOSU.
