EFFECTIVE TEACHING

I have taught courses in both the undergraduate and graduate curriculums: Foundations of Education (EDUC 2013), History and Philosophy of Education (EDUC 5103), and Educational Measurement, Assessment and Evaluation (EDUC 3113). I also taught the Freshman Orientation class (ORIE 1002) in fall, 2002.

- **EDUC 5103—History and Philosophy of Education**
Designed and developed the course for the online 7-week accelerated format. Taught in spring 2018 (Term 2), spring 2019 (Term 2), and spring 2017 (Term 2). This course had not been offered since 2010 because of various program alignments, so this iteration is largely new, with an original thematic approach (*purposes of education, technology in education, ethics and values in education, and diversity in education and society*), and a major project that addresses these themes from two perspectives: (a) in their larger historical and philosophical dimensions and (b) from the practitioner's disciplinary perspective. Hold weekly virtual meetings with students in real-time and record them for viewing by students unable to attend.
- **EDUC 5513—Professionalism, Reflection, and Ethical Practice**
A new course in the M.Ed. in Curriculum & Instruction program, *Generalist* emphasis. I designed and developed the course for the online 7-week accelerated format. Taught for the first time in fall 2017 (Term 2), and then in fall 2018, and fall 2019. Hold weekly virtual meetings with students in real-time and record them for viewing by students unable to attend.
- **EDUC 2013—Foundations of Education**
Among my achievements for this course: designed and developed the course; developed the syllabus to conform to the TEC model and aligned it to NCATE standards, State of Oklahoma standards, and in 2015 to InTASC (all instructors for this course use the syllabus I developed); have taught the course on IETV since 1999; have researched and selected the textbook used for the course; designed and developed the artifacts/assignments and assessment rubrics that are used for the Undergraduate Teaching Portfolio (and used by all instructors for this course); have taken the lead in introducing students (and other instructors that teach this course) to the Undergraduate Teaching Portfolio and now the electronic Chalk and Wire Portfolio. I designed and taught the class in a blended format (Spring 2011, Fall 2012), designed and taught the class for the first time in an online format in Spring 2012 and have taught the class in the online format every summer since 2012. For the summer of 2016, due to popular demand, a second online class section was added. Both classes were fully enrolled! In all instructional formats I continue to grow and learn as I progress in making the classes interactive, personalized, participatory, carefully thoughtful, and meaningfully enjoyable.
- **EDUC 5103—History & Philosophy of Education (Master's-level course)**
Among my achievements for this course are: have shaped the development and design of the course; developed the syllabus to conform to the TEC model and aligned it to NCATE and ELCC standards; designed the online format for the course in 2004 and have taught the course online

13 times since then; have selected the textbooks, created supplementary materials, and designed the assignments/artifacts and assessment rubrics that are used for the EDAD Portfolio for this course.

- **The SUMA evaluation** (evaluations by students of my teaching) has only been utilized once by my academic department (Spring 2004) during my tenure at Southeastern. My scores on this evaluation were outstanding. I exceeded both the institution and national means on each of the six Factors. Five of the Factors were “significantly different from the national mean” including two Factors that significantly differed at the .001 level (instructor preparation and organization, and course objectives).
- In Spring of 2010 I earned approval for **continued regular graduate faculty status**. This approval system requires documentation of scholarly activity, service to the profession, and continuing professional development to demonstrate currency in the field. As the approval letter says, “Your commitment to keeping current in your field enhances student learning.”
- **Online Teaching Certification and Certification for Professional Development in Integrating Current Technology in Instruction**
