Procedural Requirements to comply with First Amendment, Expressive Speech, and 70 O.S. §2120

This Campus Free Expression Policy shall be posted on the University website and incorporated into an annual report to the Governor of the State of Oklahoma and the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma by December 31 of each year. All such reports shall also be posted on the University website, not more than three links from the homepage and searchable by key words, and shall include:

- A statement and description of compliance with state law.
- A description of any changes or updates to policy or procedure in regard to campus expressive activity.
- A description of any barriers to or incidents of free expression occurring on campus, including but not limited to attempts to block or prohibit speakers and investigations into students or student organizations for their speech.
- A description of the nature of each barrier or incident as well as what disciplinary action, if any, was taken against members of the campus community determined to be responsible for those specific barriers or incidents involving students without revealing those students personally identifiable information.
- Any relevant information deemed valuable by the Vice President for Student Affairs or the Special Assistant to the President for Compliance for the public to evaluate whether free expression rights for all members of the campus community have been equally protected and enforced consistent with this policy and with state law.

In the event that the University receives notice of a lawsuit against the University for alleged violations of first amendment rights then the University shall, within 30 calendar days, provide a copy of the complaint or any amended complaint, to the Oklahoma Governor and the Oklahoma Legislature.

Branch Campus

This policy applies to the McCurtain County Campus in addition to the Main Campus in Durant, Oklahoma. Southeastern students and employees seeking information about speech and expression at our sites hosted by other institutions should consult those institutions.
