



A drive through the campus loop offers instant recollections for Southeastern alumni.





At one time, it was the site of administration and faculty offices, classrooms, labs, gymnasium, auditorium, and cafeteria.








Today, SE competes in the Great American Conference (NCAA Division II) represented by six men's sports and seven women's sports.







