2. How would you describe SE's mission? Do you know where you would find the official document?
3. How does the University live or fail to live its mission?
4. What are the university's current strategic planning priorities?
5. What are SE's greatest strengths?
6. What are the biggest challenges facing SE?
7. Provide an example of how SE is committed to freedom of expression.
8. Describe your codes of conduct and how they are used.
9. Do you know where to find information about academic integrity and policies regarding academic misconduct?
10. Do faculty and staff have a voice in policy changes? How or why not?
11. How are policy and procedure changes communicated to students, faculty, and staff? Does SE clearly communicate those?
12. How would you describe the campus climate for diversity?
13. Does SE treat its students, faculty, and staff fairly? How so?
14. What is it like to work at SE? How is morale on campus?
15. Do you think academics are the top priority at SE? Why or why not?
16. Describe any campus processes that could be improved or made more efficient.
17. What kind of changes are taking place at SE? Do you see these as positive or not?
18. What are you most proud of in terms of the work you do?
19. What has Southeastern, as a whole, achieved in the 10 years since its last review?
